Single and return journey tickets: Ticket prices for journeys between any two stations wholly within the London Fare Zones area are determined by the zones travelled in and through, with different prices applying for journeys which include travel on London Underground and/or Docklands Light Railway (DLR) services. Tickets between any two National Rail stations, either or both of which are outside the London Fare Zones area, and that are valid for travel 'via London', include the cost of transfer between London mainline terminals, and other designated interchanges, by Underground, DLR or First Capital Connect services via City Thameslink.

Travelcards: For unlimited travel on National Rail, Underground and DLR services within the zones, and on the day(s) for which the ticket is valid. Irrespective of the zones for which they are issued, Travelcards can be used on most London buses (except some special services and excursions), and when valid in Zones 3, 4, 5 or 6 (or any combination of these zones) can be used throughout Croydon Tramlink. *Travelcards are NOT valid at all on Heathrow Express, or on Heathrow Connect services between Hayes & Harlington and Heathrow.
